Cantor's Corner...

🎵 Notes From the Cantor 🎵

Some of you might be reading this at the beginning of the month when it is still the latter holidays of Tishrei. In that case, Moadeem I'Simchah, have a joyful remainder of the festival period, during these middle or end days of Sukkot with Shemini Atzeret and Simchat Torah. If like me, you have not built a physical Sukkah this year and it is still the remaining days of Sukkot, I urge you to google the poem, "Heart Sukkah" by Jennifer Rudick Zudnikoff. It gives actual directions to build one in spirit. The basic step in this beautiful sentiment is to open your heart to loved ones, guests, fresh air, and the stars. If you are reading this article in the latter half of October, the Hebrew month of Cheshvan is not as "bitter" as purported. Our tradition describes it as bitter because it is the only Hebrew month in which there are no holidays other than Shabbat. Furthermore, it follows after Tishrei which includes Selichot, Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, the middle days of Sukkot known as Chol HaMoed, Hoshanah Rabba, bringing the main part of Sukkot to a close, then Shemini

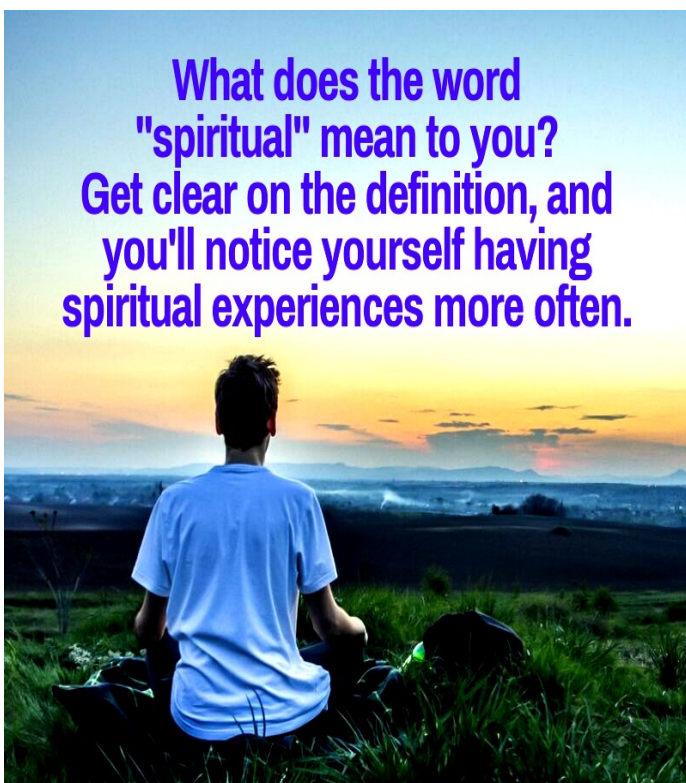
Atzeret and Simchat Torah. By the time we get to Cheshvan, we are both literally and figuratively done with holidays until Chanukah. So we anthropomorphize the month of Cheshvan, like challah being jealous of

wine, as if it were "bitter" about being the neglected child. I wouldn't describe Cheshvan as bitter. I would instead describe it, at least here in America, as "pumpkin-spiced." That pumpkin spiced flavor is everywhere you turn, in coffee and dessert options, at least for the next couple of months culminating in Thanksgiving, America's secular harvest version of Sukkot. This pumpkin spiced flavor even gets offered to those of us who are diabetic, as a low carb iced coffee comes in it. As American Jews live the transition from religious to secular Thanksgiving, I like the idea of the mundane trying to emulate the holy. Moadim L'Simchah and a Pumpkin Spiced Cheshvan to one and all.

From the President...

Having completed our High Holiday Services, I extend our sincere appreciation to Cantor Rosenman for his leadership in preparing our services and his spiritually meaningful presentation of those services. In so doing, Cantor set the appropriate mood through music and his sermons, his selection of instrumental accompanists, and choir. Cantor was supported by a team of congregant volunteers and staff whose efforts were coordinated by the Ritual Chair Pam Bain. Our congregant volunteers included Marc Bain, Ron & Laura Weening, Edie Ben Israel, Hy Kleinman, Roz & Bob RosenHanst, Amy & Brian Kass, Ellen Lieberman, and our professional staff, Sandy Corritore & Cindy Broderick. We thank each of you for your willingness to provide your time, skills, and commitment to our Temple Family.

In my Rosh Hashanah message, I asked that you consider joining one of our Temple Committees and/or offering your suggestions for programming that might be of interest to you. I believe that your time and expertise is vital to our ability to move forward in a manner that is spiritually enriching, and meets our need to be part of a vibrant social community. If you feel you have time to volunteer and/or have suggestions to offer, please contact one of the Temple Officers.

As I pointed out in my Yom Kippur message, religious organizations, such as ours, can only exist if we have the financial resources that are sufficient to meet our operating costs. The funds necessary to meet those needs traditionally come from the revenues developed through our annual dues, fund raising activities, and our High Holiday appeal. If you have not already made a High Holiday pledge, please consider doing so now. You can send your pledge to the Temple Office. Every dollar of revenue goes directly to the payment of our operating expenses.

I noted that a significant source of revenue for a religious organization is generated through membership dues. In our not-too-distant past (1995-96 fiscal year) we were a congregation of just under 400 membership units, and growing. A few years later our membership peaked at 420 membership units,

with a steady flow of revenue from membership dues, donations, and fund-raising activities. Then the religious affiliation rates of the American citizenry began to decline. For Temple Sha'arey Shalom the decline became precipitous, to our current 62 membership units. If we are to improve our financial position, it behooves us to begin an aggressive membership drive, one that can address the needs of Jewish empty nesters through appropriate and meaningful marketing. To accomplish this, we will need your assistance in developing activities that might be attractive to the Jewish empty nesters in Springfield and surrounding communities. If you have suggestions to offer and time to donate to this goal, please contact one of the Temple Officers or our Membership Chair, Brian Kass.

During the last few months I have shared with you some of the actions taken by the Temple leadership in attempting to keep us spiritually and financially viable. The committees that have been established have begun or are about to begin their work. As we move forward, we will do our best to provide you with relevant information concerning the progress of each committee. Such sharing of progress will occur through reports to the Temple Board at our monthly meetings, and through letters from the Temple President. To help your Temple leadership keep you appropriately and factually informed, please disregard information that you hear from other sources.

My friends, as I stated in my Yom Kippur message: "If we are to remain a vibrant family, rich with social interaction, committed to social action, and enriching educational and spiritual experiences we must all put forth our own personal efforts in supporting each other as a valued member of our family. It will be through our personal efforts and comradery that we will be able to move forward from strength to strength".

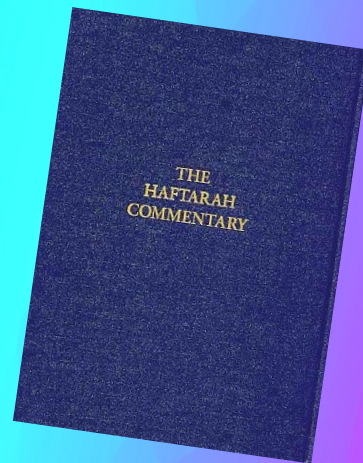
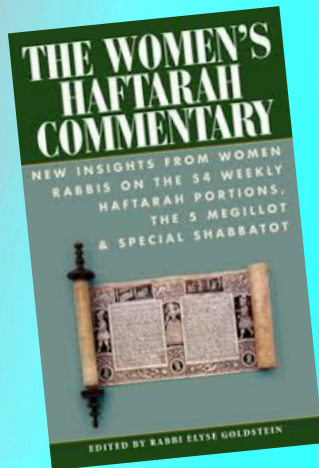

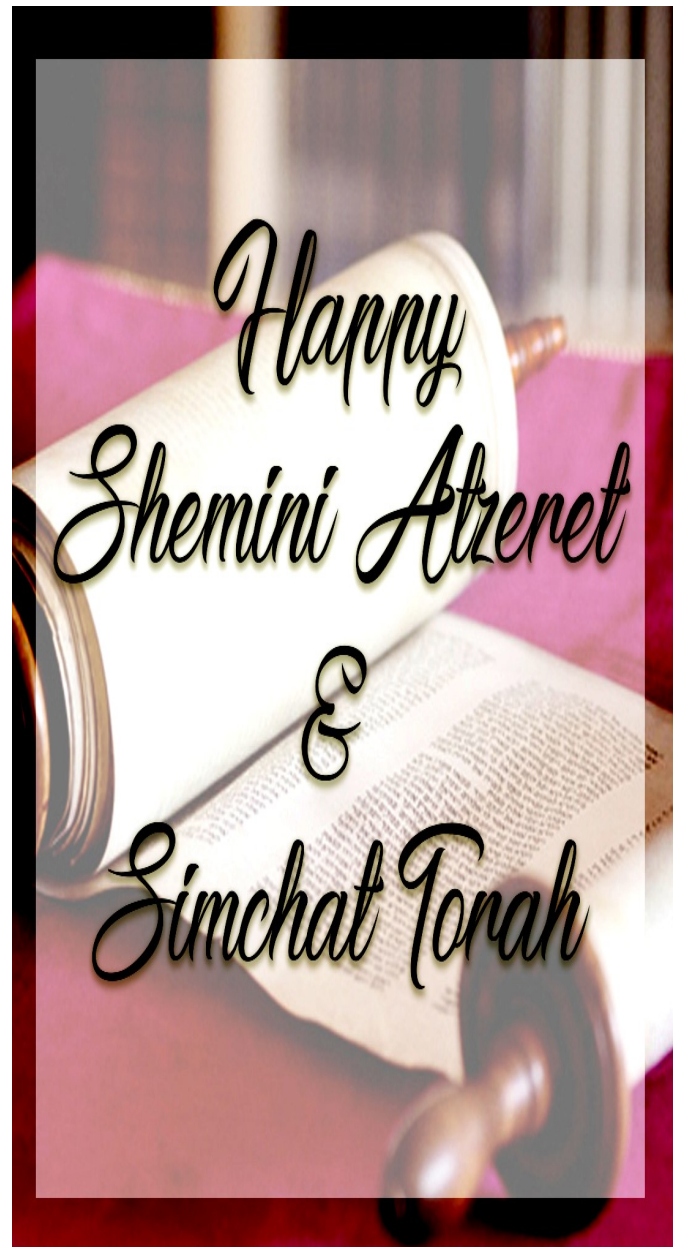

Following the seven joyous days of Sukkot, comes the happy holiday known as Shemini Atzeret/Simchat Torah.

Simchat Torah: October 6-8, 2023



Following the [seven joyous days of Sukkot](#), we come to the happy holiday of Shemini Atzeret/Simchat Torah.

In the diaspora, the first day is known by its biblical name, Shemini Atzeret. We still dwell in the sukkah, but without a blessing. [Yizkor](#), the memorial for the departed, is also said on this day.

The second day is known as Simchat Torah, during which we complete and immediately begin the annual Torah reading cycle. This joyous milestone is marked with dancing, traditionally following seven circuits known as [hakafot](#), as the Torah scrolls are held aloft.

Both days are celebrated by nightly candle lighting, festive meals at both night and day, and [desisting from work](#). In Israel, the entire holiday is compacted into one heady 24-hour period.
