From the Rabbi...

Counting Up Towards Torah

When you find yourself keeping track of time do you count up or count down? I suspect that in many cases you may find yourself counting down. "Only two more days until Shabbat!", you might say. Or perhaps the countdown may be in anticipation of a long awaited vacation or family simcha? We see countdowns happening all around us. In most sporting events, the clock descends in time. On New Year's Eve we sit on the edge of our seats watching the ball drop as the clock counts down the year and begins another.

Counting backwards has a certain effect on us. We see the reset of the timepiece as a metaphor for being able to reset and recalibrate our own lives. It heightens the sense of anticipation and holds our focus toward our final goal. It can direct our intention towards fuller preparation for what lies ahead, and make the moment of transition forward a time to celebrate accomplishments and achievements.

In our Jewish calendar we find ourselves in a time of counting. Sefirat HaOmer, the period between Pesach and Shavuot, is a time when we

focus our attention ahead towards the Revelation of Sinai. But we do not start our count at 50 and work backwards. Rather our sefirah, our counting, ascends each day as we draw ever nearer to Torah. In fact we do not

simply count the days, but the weeks as well. This is highly stylized and specialized counting to be sure.

Indeed, counting up can produce similar effects to counting down. It is an attention grabber, it helps us focus, and it shines a light on our ultimate goal during this time of the year. But there is a significant difference to be noted in counting the Omer. Counting these days and weeks leading up to, and culminating in Shavuot, is a spiritual practice. When we count down to our vacation, exciting as it may be, we do not do so out of a sense of spirituality or common purpose with the rest of *Am Yisrael*. It is an individual pursuit and an experience that does not extend beyond the individual person or family.

Counting the Omer on the other hand, is a practice that emerges directly from our national experience of having been redeemed from bondage in Egypt, to our prime covenantal moment with God at Sinai. It is not a period of subtraction leaving us with double zeros at the end. It is a period of addition with each day contributing renewed energy and excitement for Torah and Jewish living.


Our TSS community is dedicated to Torah, worship, and acts of loving kindness. Indeed these are the very things that sustain our world according to Pirkei Avot. As we journey towards receiving the Torah (again) at Shavuot we can be confident and comforted that our priorities are in the right place for our sacred kehilah.

Our tradition teaches that we should always strive to ascend in holiness and not descend. I pray that

this year our counting of each new day of the Omer will be imbued with increased anticipation, focus and holiness as we journey to stand again at Sinai as a nation united in Torah.

§ Notes From the Cantor §

"The Lord is my engineer.
The Lord is the earth I ride on.
The Lord is the face in the atmosphere,

The path I slip and slide on.

The Lord is a virgin forest

The Lord is a forest ranger

The Lord is a meal for the poorest of the poor

A welcome door to the stranger"

—-Paul Simon

The above lyrics get reprised with some variation by the legendary artist Paul Simon in the album that he released about a year ago called, <u>Seven Psalms</u>. The album is about 33 minutes long and is his fifteenth solo studio album. It is a contemplative album with mostly acoustic guitar playing, and also features the voice of Edie Brickell, his wife, as well as Voces8.

The Biblical book of Psalms, called "Tehillim" in Hebrew, is a compilation of 150 prayer poems attributed to King David and others. We recite various samples of them on Shabbat, Holidays, and many different occasions, happy and sad alike. These inspired Paul Simon to write seven modern ones set to music. He says that the idea came to him in a dream, one that specifically came to him on January 15, 2019, in which he clearly received a message that he was supposed to be working on seven psalms. He has recounted that the lyrics came to him between 3:30 and 5:00 AM several mornings in a row. Like in the Biblical book, Simon describes God using several metaphors such as "the path that I slip and slide on." Long time fans of his might recognize the "slipping and sliding" from an older Paul Simon song. In

another, harsher lyric, he equates God with the Covid virus.

Unlike the 150 Biblical Psalms, Paul Simon's Seven Psalms are titled. He respectively calls them: "The Lord", "Love is Like a Braid", "My Professional Opinion", "Your Forgiveness", "Trail of Volcanoes", "The Sacred Harp", and "Wait." In one of them, he pays a tribute to King David. "The sacred harp," writes Simon, "that David played to make his songs of praise, we long to hear those strings that set his heart ablaze."

While Seven Psalms is certainly a spiritual work, it doesn't seem like Paul Simon has intended it to be exclusively for Jews. Simon for most of his life has seemed to identify more as a secular, cultural Jew. Yet many Jewish fans of his have certainly found Jewish spirituality in the work, as well as consolation and comfort in a post-10/7 world, though it was written before 10/7. Mallory Mosner, writing for the Havurah Journal stated, "This album has set my heart ablaze. It has not only provided space for daily meditation, solace, and reflection during this overwhelmingly terrifying time, but it has reinforced to me the transcendental power and beauty of Jewish art—perhaps even touching on the secret chord."


INSTALLATION SHABBAT JUNE 14, 2024
